

Policy Document Title: Pupil Premium Policy

Pupil Premium was introduced to bridge the attainment gap for:

- pupils registered as eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) from Reception to Year 11
- 'Looked After Children' (children who have been looked after continuously for more than six months) from Year 1 to Year 11.
- children whose parents are currently serving in the armed forces. This service premium is designed to address the emotional and social well-being of these pupils.

Pupil Premium is additional to our main school funding.

Objectives

- 1. The additional funding will be used to address any underlying inequalities between children eligible for Pupil Premium and others.
- 2. We will ensure that the additional funding reaches the pupils who need it most.
- 3. The Pupil Premium will be used to provide additional support to raise the standard of achievement for these pupils.

Strategies

- 1. Pupil Premium will be clearly identifiable within the budget.
- 2. The Principal, in consultation with the governors and staff, will decide how the Pupil Premium is spent for the benefit of entitled pupils.
- 3. The school will assess what additional provision should be made for the individual pupils.
- 4. The school will be accountable for how it has used the additional funding to support the achievement of those pupils covered by the Pupil Premium
- 5. The school will publish information about how we have used the Pupil Premium on the school website.
